Dear Parents and Guardians of Students Enrolled in Grades 6, 7, 8:

Within the next several days, you will be receiving by US mail a survey that has been approved by the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Secretariat for Catholic Education. The survey has been prepared in consultation with us by Meitler Consultants which has worked with our diocese on a number of similar projects. In cooperation with our Catholic school principals and our catechetical administrators of parish religious education programs, we are working with Meitler to determine your interest and possible commitment to have your sons and daughters attend a new Catholic high school to be located in Cranberry.

As you know, the diocese is in the process of determining the feasibility of building a new Catholic high school on a 71-acre site in Cranberry Township. This state-of-the-art school, to be named the Cardinal Wuerl North Catholic High School, is expected to eventually enroll as many as 1,000 students in grades 9-12, beginning with the initial enrollment of students as early as the fall of the 2013-14 school year. This school will also incorporate and carry on the legacy and program of the current North Catholic High School located on Troy Hill in Pittsburgh.

Please review the survey thoroughly and please respond to each item in the survey, for it is the collective responses to each item we receive from our families that will provide us with one of the most important sources of information we need before finalizing the remaining details of the project.
